## **FOREWARD**

It was the twilight of 30th January, 2011, the 63rd death anniversary of Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi i.e Mahatma Gandhi, when seven like-minded professional team forming the board of founding executive committee members came together over a coffee table at a theme park in Mira Road, Mumbai with an idea, purpose and commitment to serve the underprivileged Indian communities impacting their lives for better future and discussed the formation of a non-governmental organization (NGO) that would address many pressing issues related to healthcare, literacy through education and social welfare under the leadership of the founders i.e Dr John Sircar and Dr Pramod Pasi who conceptualized the formation of the organization and christened it as "Helping Hand Foundation" (HHF) with a vision and mission to impact lives of under privileged beneficiaries, especially orphaned children, youths, broken families etc enabling them to maximize their potential and change their lives irrespective of caste, creed, religion or gender.

We have successfully completed two years of existence having organized free medical health check-up camps for the beneficiaries of rural sectors off Mumbai city limits, distributed free pre-owned clothes and organized a fund raising event in association with the leading English standup comedy group i.e Schitzengiggles which was also supported by Samhita Social Ventures, Mumbai.

On the legal front, we are proud to bring on record that we have obtained registrations under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, The Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950 and PAN Card under the Income Tax Act; we have applied for 12A certification which is a stepping stone to obtain 80G certification after completion of three years.

Our temporary website, (www.hhfngo2011.weebly.com) located on a free website builder site was redesigned and updated, we are waiting for the new domain (.ngo) to be launched for the ngo sector in 2014 by the Indian government, till then the current website on www.weebly.com shall be functional and regularly updated.

- 2. To run free or with (nominal fees) coaching classes and tailoring classes for economically weaker sections as well as open, run and manage computer classes for street children and children of below poverty line families.
- 3. To established, erect, equip and maintain or contribute towards the same (libraries, free reading rooms, hospitals, dispensaries, medical clinics, Paramedical centers, nursing homes, orphanages, Junior and Senior Colleges of all the faculties), establish and run pharmacy college, B.Ed., D.Ed. Colleges, Bio-technology college, Bioinformatics Colleges, IT institutes and courses. establish electronic waste material management setup, charitable institutions, for the relief of poor, education, medical relief and advancement of other objects of general public utility not involving the carrying on of any activity of profit.
- To construct Social Welfare Center and also establish and run English, Marathi, Hindi medium educational schools, primary schools, pre-primary schools, balwadis, classes, colleges including Junior and Senior Colleges, Technical College, Barefoot Colleges, Medical colleges, Para-medical colleges, hospitals, etc..
- To provide assistance to the poor and needy students of all the communities and encourage the values of education through free school book distribution, school stationary, bags, sponsoring a child's education or a child from another ngo quarterly or annually.

- 1. To give medical, food and educational help to all disable persons, orphans, semiorphans as well as provide relief to all affected people by natural, manmade calamities.

During the financial year 2012-2013, we had organized one free medical health check-up camp in which the residents from the Krishna Kirtan CHSL, Vasai East benefitted through accessing all the free services the camp offered which included free screening of Blood pressure, Blood sugar, height/weight, eye screening, blood grouping along with free consultations and examinations by expert medical team, distribution of free medicines and blood group cards. All the records of the camps were maintained and post camp analysis were done with suitable remedial advices by the camp team were recorded.

The volunteers and team members who assisted us in our above said camp were served breakfast, lunch and tea by the organizing committee of Krishna Kirtan CHSL, Vasai East for which we are very thankful.

#### **COMMUNITY SERVICE**: Distribution of pre-owned clothing

Several bags of donated pre-owned clothing were distributed among the Maharashtrian marginalized communities in Gorai, Mumbai.

The communities numbering about 150 odd residents reside by the Arabian Sea in temporary structures erected on a government owned plot of hill-top land with no medical or educational facilities in the vicinity. They follow the Buddhist religion and speak Marathi and have to travel approx 2-3 kms by foot to avail basic facilities in education and a good 20 kms for medical emergencies. It is here that our organization wants to setup pre-primary schools, crèches and a free medical center, but due to constraints in funding, the projects is temporarily stalled.

We request our well-wishers, friends and members to support us as per annexed budget in our endeavor to start our first educational and medical project in this area which will impact lives for the better future of these communities.
